

United States government regulations require the University of Indianapolis to verify the availability of adequate funding for all individuals who require an F-1 student visa. This funding must cover tuition and living expenses for the duration of studies. When it is determined that a student is academically eligible for admission and financially capable of supporting his or her education, the University of Indianapolis issues an I-20 form (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status) to the student, who may use this form, along with other required documentation, to apply for an F-1 student visa at a United States embassy or consulate.

The amount of any grants or scholarships you have received from the University may be deducted from the costs shown above.

DOCUMENTATION OF FUNDS

To be considered for I-20 approval for the 2019-2020 academic year, you must document a total of \$44888 in funding.

1. Each sponsor should submit an original, completed Statement of Financial Support with bank savings verification. Acceptable forms of documentation are listed on the reverse.

An additional \$3,500 must be documented for each dependent spouse or child who will accompany you to the United States. All documents must be originals, must be accompanied by an English translation (when appropriate), and must be current (dated within six months of I-20 issuance).

Acceptable Documents:

- Dated original bank statement or letter referencing an account in the name of the student, parent, or sponsor that states specific amount available.
- Bank verification on Statement of Financial Support form.
- Scholarship letter stating the amount of funding available to the student each year and for how many years. (Scholarships and grants awarded by the University of Indianapolis will automatically be considered part of the student's resources.)
- Loan approval letter stating the amount of funding awarded to the student.

NOTES

- Payment for each semester is due before that semester begins. Students unable to pay by the due date are not allowed to enroll. Students who do not enroll, but who remain in the United States, have violated their student visa status.
- Each student is expected to know the regulations of his or her government for exchanging and forwarding money to the United States. Difficulties in this area do not excuse a student from timely payment.
- The United States government limits employment of F-1 visa holders. While jobs are available at the University of Indianapolis, students should not expect to use employment as a significant source of income.
- Any grants or scholarships from the University of Indianapolis will be awarded before a student enrolls. No additional aid can be awarded after a student enrolls.
- The University of Indianapolis does not provide loans. Information about private loans can be obtained at uindy.edu/financial-aid-for-new-students/alternative-financing-options. Private loans require a U.S. citizen cosigner and require that the student already has received an I-20 document.
- Students are advised to keep copies of all financial documents for use in the visa application process.
